




A. Widening Weir at Canal D

- Staff has reviewed topography of area in general (Lidar)
- During periods of heavy rainfall, water can "backflow" and pond, until stages recede
- A detailed drainage study would be required before any determination can be made regarding the effectiveness of widening the weir.

B. Section 7 Project

- The Contract was awarded to Johnson-Davis, Inc. in the amount of \$305,650 at the October Board meeting.
- The Contract has been fully executed and a Pre-Construction meeting was held on November 30, 2022.
- The Notice to Proceed date is December 12, 2022, with a scheduled completion date of February 28, 2022.

B. Canal C Project Update

- Florida Department of Environmental Protection notified staff that a new permit reviewer has been assigned to the project.
- The next step will be a site inspection with Florida Department of Environmental Protection prior to their review of our request for a Section 404 "No Permit Required".
- Florida Department of Environmental Protection forms and COI required for execution of the grant agreement have been sent to Florida Department of Environmental Protection.

D. Road Paving Petitions

Staff is working with Legal and the Treasurer on the Referendum documents for:

- 153rd Court North between 69th Drive North and 69th Trail North
 - 4 parcels
 - District financing
 - Estimated total construction cost including engineering, legal, and contingency is \$96,300
- 160th Street North between 72nd Drive North to the end
 - 2 parcels
 - Landowner financing
 - Estimated total construction cost including engineering, legal, and contingency is \$81,900


E. Water Quality Sampling

Staff recommendations on monitoring program modifications.

- Reduce metals monitoring location to SW-1
- Add two sucralose monitoring locations One at Jupiter Commerce Park and the other in Jupiter Farms
- Add E Coli as a monitoring parameter; continue to monitor for fecal coliform to compare results/trends
