




South Indian River Water Control District Proposed 2023-2024 Budget

A. Section 7 Update

- Staff received the final as-built information from Johnson-Davis on the four (4) additional culverts, as well as some corrected data on the riser structures.
- A calculation to determine the impacts of the difference in elevation has been performed and is being reviewed.

B. Canal C Project Update

- The Florida Department of Environmental Protection issued a letter on June 23, 2023, confirming that the project does not require a permit under the State 404 Program.
- The Engineer is proceeding with preparation of the contract documents to advertise the project for soliciting bids.

D. 20th Plan of Improvements

- A Purchase Order is being processed for the roadway survey required to use as a base for the construction plans.
- While waiting on the survey, other plans such as the cover page, typical details and notes will be prepared.

7. Engineer's Report (6)



E. Budget for Modeling Palm Beach Country Estates Drainage Study

- Staff previously estimated:
 - Palm Beach Country Estates Modeling/Drainage Study Fee = \$125,000
 - Canal D Modeling/Study Fee = \$36,300
- Pricing was received from Legacy Surveying which was substantially lower than our estimate.
- Staff confirmed that Legacy understood the project scope and priced the work accordingly.
- This will lower the Palm Beach Country Estates Drainage Study fee to under \$100,000.

- E. Update on Florida Power and Light Pole Conflict with Busch Culvert
